A world-famous Kutani-yaki. The climbing kiln from the restoration of Kutani ceramics approx. 180 years ago is exhibited.

九谷焼窯元 須田菁華 Kutani pottery "Suda Seika"

A store that maintains the traditional manufacturing process for Kutani ceramics. This store is famous for teaching ceramics to Rosanjin Kitaoji.

Closed ■ Irregular closing days

はづちを楽堂 Hazuchio Gakudo

An open space with the flavor of a traditional Japanese cityscape. There are galleries, nice coffee shops, and souvenir shops.

魯山人寓居跡いろは草庵 Iroha Soan Hut (Rosanjin's temporary residence)

Rosanjin Kitaoji, a unique artist of the Taisho period, stayed here. The Japanese style house with its study and the patio is preserved as it was at that time.

Yunogawa in Yamashiro Hot Springs

Yunogawa is an area where the streets are arranged centered around the hot spring. Yamashiro Hot Springs is said to be the last remaining hot spring area in Japan with both an appearance left behind from olden days, and with natural scenery.

The streets in Yunogawa are now even more charming with the addition of two public hot spring baths. Why not come and experience the amazing feeling of hot springs as they used to be in the Meiji era.

山代温泉「古総湯」「総湯」 Kosoyu and Soyu at Yamashiro Hot Springs

These are public baths with a long history, and are where local people, and of course visitors, come to relax. You can buy hot spring boiled eggs at the entrance.

Entrance fee ■ 500 Yen (Adults, Kosoyu)
Entrance fee ■ 420 Yen (Adults, Soyu)
Opening times ■ 06:00-22:00

Closed on the morning of the fourth Wednesday of each month

Kosoyu

These are public baths that have been restored to how they used to be in the Meiji era (mid 19th century to early 20th century). Not only have both their outer appearance and inside been restored, but you can also experience the way of getting into them as it used to be in those days. The stained glass windows have been faithfully restored, as have the walls and floors, which are made of a special type of Japanese porcelain called Kutani-yaki.



総湯
Soyu

These bright and modern shared baths were rebuilt in August 2009, and local people get together here every day. The heat exchange system uses excess waste heat, and the water is replaced every day without adding any from other sources, so 100% of the water is from the natural spring.
